La Chandeleur

La Chandeleur, also known as Candlemas, is a traditional French holiday that is celebrated on February 2nd. The holiday is characterized by the making and eating of crêpes, which is a traditional French dish and is often served with a variety of sweet or savory fillings. La Chandeleur is a time to enjoy the company of family and friends.



La Chandeleur is a time of transition between the end of winter and the beginning of spring. The holiday takes place on February 2nd, which is traditionally considered to be the midpoint of winter.

As the days begin to get longer and the weather starts to get milder, La Chandeleur marks the end of the darkest and coldest part of the year and the beginning of the return of light and warmth.

The round shape & the golden color of the crêpe, which is achieved by cooking it until it is golden brown, is said to resemble the sun which is a symbol of light, warmth and renewal.

By the way, do you know how to make a good Crêpe?

For sweet Crêpes, ingredients:

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/2 cup water
- 2 tablespoons melted butter
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- Pinch of salt

Instructions:

- In a large mixing bowl, whisk together the flour, eggs, milk, water, melted butter, sugar, and salt until smooth.
- Let the batter rest for at least 30 minutes in the refrigerator.
- Heat a non-stick skillet over medium heat.
- Once the skillet is hot, ladle about 2 tablespoons of batter into the skillet, swirling the skillet to coat the bottom evenly.
- Cook the crêpe for 1-2 minutes on each side, or until golden brown.
- Serve the crêpes with your desired filling such as Nutella, fruit, whipped cream or any other sweet toppings.

Les carnivals

The carnival period varies greatly from place to place; in Europe, they are generally associated with the winter period, from November at the earliest to May at the latest.

Carnival parades are celebrated in many parts of France. Parades in northern towns, for example, are famous for their giants. It is also called "Mardi Gras" because it is the last day before Lent. On this day, eating crêpes is a tradition enjoyed by all. The high point of the Carnival is the parades, with the participants on foot or in floats in front of the spectators who crowd the pavements to admire the fanciful costumes.

Le carnaval de Dunkerque - 6 January 2024

Some historians agree that it all began in the early 17th century, with the parties given by shipowners before Dunkirk sailors set off to fish for cod off Iceland. These fishing expeditions lasted several months, and no one was quite sure of coming back... So, before leaving, they spent part of the advance on their wages to have a good time.

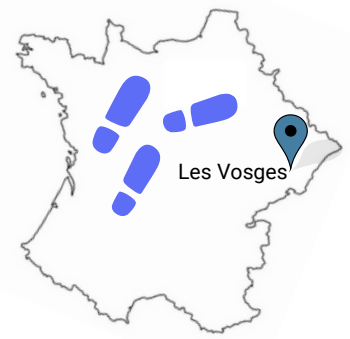

Winter Walks

Les Vosges



Lac Gérardmer (pronounced Gérarmé)



Perched at an altitude of 660m, this glacial lake is the largest in the region. You can walk or cycle around it on a 6km trail.

If you're a dreamer, you can find wild spots or admire the trees reflected in the water, the cute ducklings and the colours of each season. For those with a sweet tooth, there's the Saturday morning market, where you can buy Morbier cream in winter, potato pancakes, sausages...And for the sporty types, there are plenty of activities on offer, such as sailing, canoeing, pedalos, etc. You can also climb to the top of the Mérelle tower if you're looking for a viewpoint overlooking the lake!

Lac des Corbeaux (Ravens lake)

Lac des Corbeaux can be discovered after a short twenty-minute walk through the snow-covered fir trees if you go in winter.

The tour of the lake is accessible to all, and can be done on foot in half an hour, with possible extensions via the lake rock, which takes around 1 hour 30 minutes to walk and gives you a view of the lake from above (good shoes required).

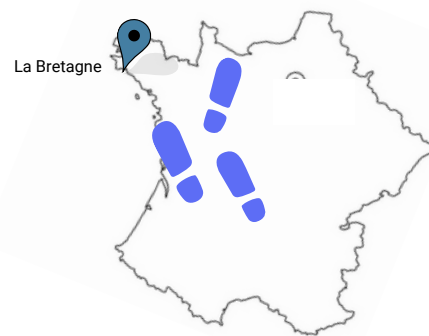


You enter the picture from a bridge, which is the starting point for the walk. You can then walk around it, with a few signs explaining the flora and fauna along the way.

To discover this lake, you can start from Lac de la Ténine, a little further down: the two are linked by a magnificent walk through the fir trees, and when they are covered in snow, it's a Nordic paradise. In winter, you can go snowshoeing or cross-country skiing here.

La Pointe du Raz

Designated a Grand Site de France, the Pointe du Raz is a natural masterpiece. Between waves and steep rocks, you'll be fascinated by the wild beauty of this headland that marks the westernmost tip of the country. Here, Finistère lives up to its name: you'll feel far, far away, at the end of the world...

Grand site Gâvres-Quiberon

As if moored to the Atlantic, the Gâvres-Quiberon site is the largest dune massif in Bretagne. This wild ocean landscape is home to exceptional flora and fauna.

Take to your bikes on the GR 34! On the seaside, you'll be treated to breathtaking views of the fine sandy beaches from Etel to Plouharnel, or the jagged cliffs and secret coves of the wild Quiberon coast. In the countryside, you'll come across dolmens, menhirs and other covered walkways.



Le Golfe du Morbihan

"Mor bihan"... the little sea, in Breton. Here you can't really tell whether it's the ocean that's entered the countryside or vice versa. Bright lights, islands and islets as if it were raining, pretty seaside houses... this is the Gulf of Morbihan, the pearl of Southern Brittany, designated a Regional Nature Park.

It stretches over some forty square kilometres, between Vannes and Auray to the north, and Arzon and Sarzeau to the south.

Winter Recipe



Le Gratin Dauphinois

Ingédients

For 6 people



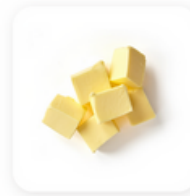
poivre



sel



muscade



100 g
de beurre



1.5 kg
de pomme de terre



2 gousses
d'ail



30 cl
de crème



1 l
de lait



Méthode

Step 1 : Peel, wash and cut the potatoes into thin slices (NB: do not wash them AFTER cutting them, as the starch is necessary for the correct consistency).

Step 2 : Chop the garlic very finely.

Step 3 : Bring the milk, garlic, salt, pepper and nutmeg to the boil in a saucepan, then add the potatoes and cook for 10 to 15 minutes, depending on their firmness.

Step 4 : Preheat the oven to 180°C (gas mark 6) and butter a gratin dish with a sheet of kitchen paper.

Step 5 : Place the drained potatoes in the dish in layers. Between each layer, add the cream and garlic, then place small knobs of butter on top.

Step 6 : Bake in the oven for 50 minutes to 1 hour.

You can add cheese, mushrooms, salmon, spinach or any other customisation!

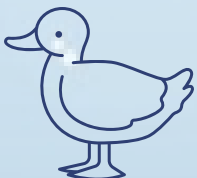

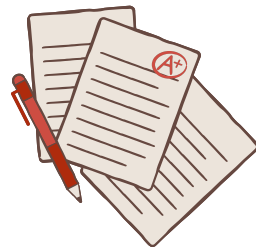

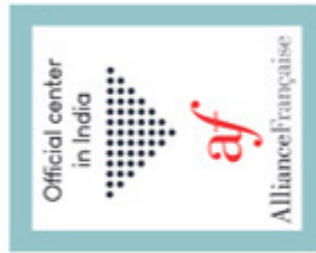

Meet Vincent, a French Traveller, around the world



My name is Vincent, I'm French and I've been driving from France to Leh in Ladhak since June 2022.

Why Leh? I went there 14 years ago on a round-the-world trip, and as I rounded a corner I came across motorbikes with German number plates. I was really surprised! I told myself it was a big trip. Since then, I've done a few trips, before deciding to take three years off to take this new challenge and to take a professional break.

Where did you travel to?

I crossed Europe via the Balkans, Turkey, Georgia, Armenia, Iran, Iraq, Jordan, Palestine, Israel, Saudi Arabia, Oman, the United Arab Emirates, Pakistan and I arrived in India in July. In all, I've been to around twenty countries. Some countries you like to stay in longer than others, but that depends on the individual. Personally, I crossed Europe quickly because I already knew most of the countries.

Do you plan your trip in advance or is it all up to you?

It's all by feel. I was thinking of going to India straight after Iran, but in the end I changed the course. This enabled me to discover other countries that I hadn't thought of, like Iraq for example. Since I have the time, I don't rush. In fact, I'm going much more slowly than I thought. The only problem is the weather; you have to be a bit strategic to avoid the rainy seasons and so on.

What was your favourite part of the route? What made the biggest impression on you?

There were some countries that I didn't know before and that surprised me. The mountainous regions of India and Pakistan are landscapes that particularly impressed me. I also discovered the deserts of Saudi Arabia, splendid areas in their wild state because there are very few tourists or infrastructure. The Omani coast is also very wild and beautiful.

Then there's the human side: I discovered a whole new population and culture. I was very surprised in Iraq, a country that has always been at war, but where people are very welcoming. In all the countries I visited, I was made to feel very welcome, and I didn't encounter any problems or have any bad experiences.

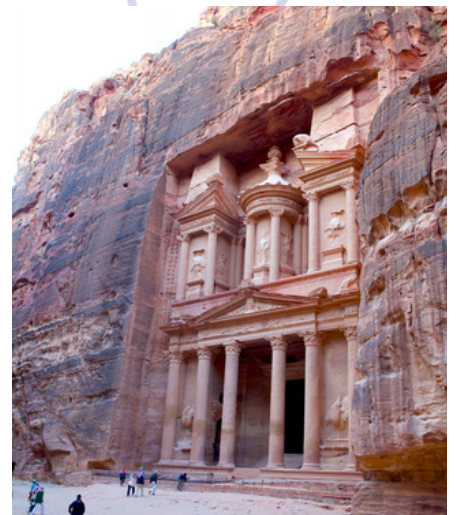

No, it's not a burden. I've travelled as a couple in the past, and it was great because you share everything and keep a link with the person for life, because you shared that moment. When you travel alone, you only share with yourself. With today's applications, it's easy to stay in touch with your family. It helps to keep a link, to reassure the family and to reassure me.

What is it like to arrive in a new country? What are the first things you have to do?

As soon as I arrive in a country, I have to find an ATM to get some local currency in cash. Then I have to find insurance for the vehicle and a shop for a sim card. It's become a ritual every time I cross a new border. Then I observe the habits of the locals. For the first two days, I look at how the locals work and then I try to adapt. When you change countries, it's a bit like starting from scratch. I also try to learn a few words in the local language. I take a piece of paper and write down ten or so words that I can then use. It's a small effort but it always pleases the locals.

What's life like in your car? What problems do you encounter?

My vehicle isn't very big, so I can get around the streets of capital cities very quickly. It's a 4x4, so it allows me to get off the roads a bit and set up in bivouacs that are a bit wild, spots with incredible views. I've never had any problems parking my vehicle in the evening. It's fairly inconspicuous, apart from the steering wheel on the left and my French number plate.

I have inadvertently parked on military land at night, so police officers have come to meet me, and the dialogue has always gone well.

My vehicle is comfortable. I have a small kitchen, with a sink and hot water, two gas rings, a fridge, a small outside shower and I can also shower inside, a toilet, a sitting area that converts into a bed, a heater and I can stand up inside!

Coming back to India, what are your next plans?

Now I'm heading for Nepal. I'm going to make the most of the good season and then come back to India. Then I'd like to go to Bangladesh and then maybe come back to India. After that, I don't have a definite route. India's a big country, so it's hard to see everything!

I'm a gourmet and I love discovering new foods, so of course I love Indian cuisine. The locals are very welcoming and often very curious to see me with my car. For the moment I've only discovered the north of the country and I can't wait to discover more! On the negative side, I'd say the driving. Especially as my steering wheel is on the right, I don't have the reflexes, but you get used to it.
