












Fête du Citron

The Fête du Citron is a carnival event organised by the tourist office of the city of Menton, France, and held every year at the end of winter.

It is also sometimes called Carnaval de Menton (Carnival of Menton).

The festival celebrates the annual production of specialty lemons and other citrus fruits in Menton. All the floats and sculptures present at the carnival are created from lemons and oranges.

The celebration takes place every year in mid-February.

Every year there is a different theme for the parades. For example, the mentioned images are from themes called 'Bollywood (2018)' and 'The tribulations of a lemon in

China (2015)'

The artists stage it with magnificent creations.

Did you know? More than 150 tons of citrus fruits are needed to make these sculptures.

At night, the yellow becomes gold and the play of light is surprising.

You'll see the exhibition differently. Festive, popular and for all ages, Menton's Fête du Citron is an event not to be missed on the Côte d'Azur.

CHARPAK LAB SCHOLARSHIP







This program is designed for Indian students enrolled in an Indian institution at the Bachelor's or Master's levels, planning to undertake a training/research project at a French laboratory or institution during their academic break (May to July).

BENEFITS: The scholarship covers the following benefits

- monthly stipend of 700 euros for maximum 2 months (preferably between May and July) provided by the Embassy of France in India
- student visa and Etudes en France fee waiver

Note: The scholarship does NOT cover medical or travel expenses, travel insurance or assistance with finding accommodation.

ELIGIBILITY: The applicant must:

- be an Indian national residing in India at the time of application
- not be more than 30 years old at the time of application
- be currently enrolled in an Indian institution of higher learning at Bachelor's/Master's level
- be in possession of an admission/acceptance letter from a French laboratory or institution where the research internship/project will be carried out. You must approach the laboratory or institution on your own, as per your research interest before applying for the scholarship.
- the duration of the research internship/project must not be less than 1 month and must not exceed 2 months. If the duration exceeds 2 months, the awardees will have to cover the expenses for rest of the duration by themselves.
- Knowledge of French language will be an asset but it is not mandatory.

SELECTION PROCEDURE: The application will be selected on the basis of academic excellence as well as the consistence and quality of the candidate's statement of purpose. There is no CGPA/ Percentage cut off for the scholarship.

ONLINE APPLICATION PROCEDURE: The students must submit their application on the online scholarship portal http://ifi.scholarship.ifindia.in/

TIMELINE:

Start Date of the application: Tuesday, 13 December 2022

End Date of the application: Monday, 13 February 2023 (23:59 IST)

Result declaration: Third week of March 2023

CRÊPES

The round shape and golden colour of crêpes *represent the sun*. From *February*, days start to get longer and eating of crêpes also refers to the arrival of spring and brighter days.

French beignets are part of the most famous dishes prepared in France for the occasion of Mardi-Gras or Carnival, celebrated during the month of March. The pastry usually consists of deep-fried dough and is a sort of doughnut.

Here is a super easy recipe for quiche lovers.

Remember, the meat used can be replaced by your favorite vegetables.

This recipe is for a single crust quiche.

INGREDIENTS:

- 250g pie dough *(for a 9" baking pan)
- 4 large eggs
- 1/3 cup of milk
- ¼ teaspoon of salt
- 1/8 teaspoon black pepper
- 3-4 slices of bacon cooked and cut
- I cup of cooked and cut sausages
- ½ cup of ham
- 2 large green onions, chopped
- I cup grated cheese

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Preheat the oven to 220°C. Press the crust into the quiche pan, prick it and bake until slightly golden (about 5 minutes).
- In a large bowl, blend eggs, milk, salt and pepper.
 Garnish with bacon, sausage, ham, green onions and cheese evenly, over pre-baked crust. Gently pour the egg mixture over it.
- 3. Bake for another 30-35 minutes until the center is well cooked. Keep checking to avoid over-cooking the quiche. Allow it to cool down for a while before serving.

Serve it with your favorite side vegetables or salads. Relish your quiche!






EVERYDAY IS PRIDE!

My name is **Gabriel**, I am 20 years old and I identify as FTM/FTX. I was born a girl, but now I live as a man in my daily life. My pronouns in English are he/him & they/them. In French, only il/lui.

I think, nowadays people are becoming more accepting towards LGBTQ



My day-to-day life depends on which country I'm in.

In France, people don't seem to care too much about my identity. Sometimes they mistake me for a woman and immediately apologise for calling me "madame" once they hear my deep voice. This creates some funny situations, but nothing serious.

Whereas, when I'm in India, I generally feel uncomfortable going out alone as I'm unfamilier with what way people might react towards me.

Dealing with Homophobia/Transphobia:

If I feel that I am not in danger, I try to discuss and reason with the other person by educating them on what it is like to be a trans.

However, If I feel like a discussion is not going to work, I simply avoid the subject and run away from the situation with a little smile so as not to create animosity.

A message to someone who recently came out:

Don't try to copy other people's stories. I started my transition at a young age (around 13) and at that time I could only identify with other trans people on social media, who obviously shared different and often idealised stories. So I wasted years finally playing a role before fully embracing MY own identity. It's completely fine to find a safe place in a community, but don't forget to make your own way! You are strong.






