DISCOVER FRANCE NORMANDY



When it comes to gastronomy, Normandy is not to be outdone, thanks to the richness of its cuisine. The region is known as one of the most famous in France for its cheeses and dairy products. Also known for its apples, this fruit is used in all sorts of ways, including in desserts and regional drinks.

This region has a rich history dating back many centuries. Situated between France and England, Normandy is a land of trade between the two shores of the English Channel, the sea that separates the two countries.

Normandy is well known as a major tourist destination in France, for both international and domestic travelers. The Region also boasts the closest beaches to Paris, and easy access by rail and road.

1000TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CITY OF CAEN



2025 is an anniversary year for Normandy. The city of Caen, capital of the region - shared with the city of Rouen - is celebrating the millennium of its foundation. With a focus on the city's history, heritage, people and artists, celebrates an historic it's anniversary. Festivities of all kinds will take place from March to December 2025.







The castle of Caen is a main monument and a symbol of the city of Caen. The castle has not been inhabited for a long time but is rather used as a social meeting place. Indeed, today, almost 1000 years after its construction, the only remains left are it's fortifications. The interior of the castle courtyard has been landscaped with parks, playgrounds and museums, to combine the social, green and historical aspects.

During the opening ceremony of the millennium festivities, a phenomenal sound and light performance has been held on the fortifications of the castle, topped off by a fireworks display in the skies above the castle of Caen. This event attracted a large number of citizens who were very proud of their city and wanted to celebrate its anniversary.

Caen's millennium is the most important event of 2025 in Normandy, and one that will leave its mark on people's minds for a long time to come. With this in mind, the French postal service decided to issue a stamp commemorating the event.



DISCOVERING CÔTE FLEURIE... ON HORSEBACK





Horses play a very important role in Normandy and its culture. You can often see horses running (with their riders) on it's beaches, as well as on it's little countrysides roads. Along with cows, they are the two most common animals in the region.

Many people in Normandy love to ride horses for leisure. They're many riding schools and stud farm in the area.

If you're visiting the region, a horseback ride, preferably during sunset, could be the perfect way to round off a day of discovery. To do this, you'll have to get in touch with the nearest tourist office (they're everywhere) beforehand to make sure it happen.

The coasts of the Calvados department are the most famous for this type of walk, because their sand is fine and access to the beaches is easier, as there are no cliffs.

The amazing experience of doing horse riding between sea and land will offer you an ultimate connection with both nature and sea and provide you unforgettable memories.

DISCOVERING SUISSE NORMANDE ... BY BICYCLE





Although Normandy boasts a wide variety of landscapes, its topography is relatively flat and low-lying. However, it is possible to gain a little height by visiting Suisse Normande.

Located just half an hour's drive from Caen, the landscape here is very different from the rest of the region. In fact, the Suisse Normande is a collection of small, low-lying mountains, creating a real contrast.

The area is highly appreciated for its proximity to nature, making it ideal for outdoor activities such as hiking, cycling and paragliding. The spirit here is very different from that of the coast, but the feeling of being in the middle of wide-open spaces is still very much present.

The river "Orne" flows through the mountains, bringing a certain coolness in summer and making the area even more bucolic. Birdsongs and the sound of the river accompany the traveller.

A 40-kilometers trail, half cycling, half walking, linking Caen to Suisse Normande has been built in recent years. This follows a local policy to build more outdoor infrastructures such as walking zones and cycle paths or airstrips. The trail is becoming increasingly popular with locals and visitors alike.

On foot or by bike, you'll pass through many small villages, many of which have a bakery where you can buy a croissant, or a restaurant where you can recharge your batteries while sampling local specialities. A truly French experience!

DISCOVERING CÔTE D'ALBÂTRE ... BY FOOT OR BY BICYCLE

Côte d'albâtre is distinguished by its towering cliffs and pebble beaches. It covers the northern part of the region, stretching over 130 km from Le Havre to as far as neighboring region of Picardy.

The cliffs of the Côte d'Albâtre are among the most famous and spectacular in France. Facing the sea, they rise to impressive heights and are often interspersed with small valleys and pebble beaches.

Between the 30 to 120 m-high cliffs (the most famous of which are those at Étretat and the highest at Le Tréport), valleys, or hanging valleys of small coastal rivers, have formed, along with a few exceptional areas of sand, clay and pebble accumulation.

Sections of the cliffs collapse regularly, and their base is exposed to high tide twice a day. The flint, fallen or torn away, is then polished by waves and wind. And that's the reason for the pebble beaches on this coast.

Discovering this coastline on foot thanks to its paths or by bike (like our chef Govinda) is a great way to discover another side of Normandy.





Tarte aux pommes

Normandy is a region well known in France for it's apples. When traveling around the region, you'll be able to see apple trees everywhere as they're fully part of the very green landscape.

Tarte aux pommes is the most famous and popular dessert of Normandy. You'll be able find that amazing cake in every bakery. This cake is also popular in the rest of France. Made of a short crust pastry with an apple mousse on top and thin slices of apple passed over to cover the tart, this tarte will give you a sweet break.




- 3/4 cup (110g) flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 4 ounces (115g) unsalted butter, cubed and well-chilled
- 3 tablespoons ice water

For the apples and glaze

- 1 1/2 pounds (700g) apples, about 4 medium apples
- 11/2 to 2 tablespoons melted butter
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- apple jelly, apricot jam, or red currant jelly, thinned with just enough hot water until brushable

Tarte aux pommes is an easy dish to make. If you want to make it at home to surprise your guests or family, you can follow the recipe attached.

And the most important thing: Bon appétit!





The Famous "la mère Poulard" Omelette

La mère Poulard is the most famous restaurant on Mont St Michel and probably of Normandy. They place is renowned for its famous omelette and its singular history. People are travelling from all arond the world to try the unique taste of their Omelette. It's the kind of place that you need to book well in advance if you want to secure a seat. Even though the exact recipe remains a well-kept secret, one key element is the unique way the eggs are beaten - incorporating plenty of air to achieve the signature lightness structure. If you're ever planning a visit to Mont Saint-Michel, stopping by La Mère Poulard is an experience you simply can't miss

Here are a few elements of the famous recipe to try making it at home:

- Separate the egg whites from the yolks
- Whisk the yolks in a large bowl.
- Add the cream, salt and pepper. Whisk again.
- Gently fold in the stiffly beaten egg whites.
- Heat the butter in a frying pan, pour in the mixture and cook over medium heat, stirring and lifting the edges with a spatula.
- When the omelet is golden-brown, fold over and serve immediately.



APPLE BASED BEVERAGES

One of the biggest characteristic of the Normandy countryside are greens landscapes with cows and apple trees. Understandably, the large quantity of apples available did not remain untouched for long and started to be used to make not only dishes or desserts, but also drinks. Apple-based drinks come in a variety of forms, both alcoholic and non-alcoholic, this to satisfy as many people as possible. Although, it is possible to distinguish four main types of different apple based beverages from Normandy.

Apple juice is renowned for its quality, which is often considered as being exceptional. This do not contain alcohol and can be enjoyed by everyone.

Cider is a sparkling beverage with an alcohol content of 2% to 8%, obtained from the fermentation of apple juice.

Pommeau is made from freshly pressed apples and aged for at least 18 months in oak barrels and a mistelle-type aperitif spirit made by blending unfermented apple juice and brandy.

Calvados is a cider or perry brandy. It is obtained by distilling cider, and sometimes perry, and aged in oak barrels. Calvados matures over time and some bottles can be best enjoyed for several decades.

Consume Alcohol is dangerous for your health. Drink in moderation.



CAMEMBERT CHEESE

Normandy's most famous signature products. While there's no single "most popular" cheese in France, Camembert remains among the most consumed and beloved cheeses.





Although cheese are mainly made from cow's milk in France, many are also made from sheep's, goat's and buffalo's milk. Those ones are also greatly appeciated.

Did you know that cheeses are often named after the town or village where they were invented? The origins of Camembert cheese go back to the end of the 18th century, when it was first made in the small village of Camembert, in the middle of the Normandy countryside.

Although you can find local cheeses at every corner of France, Normandy is one of the key state in the production of cheeses. It's rare to find such a high concentration of cheeses on the scale of a French region.

For many french people living abroad, a slice of cheese is a guilty pleasure that reminds of home. Our chef Govinda can only relate!

"How do you expect to govern a country where there are 258 varieties of cheese?"

Charles de Gaulle - Former french president (1958-1969)

The main reason behind Normandy producing such a big amount of cheeses is probably its large green fields accommodating a variety of animals, including cows, combined with soft, moist vegetation, allowing the animals to thrive in the best possible conditions to produce the best quality of milk.

Behind every cheese, there are cheesemakers and who are passionate about their work. Sometimes, they also need some help to keep up with demand. So when students in the south of France will do the harvest during their summer beaks to earn some money to pay off their studies, in Normandy when they're not working in restaurants or tourism, they'll work in a cheese (most-likely Camembert) factory.


After being made and proportionate, the camembert are stored for a minimum ripening time of 21 days before being packed and sold everywhere around the world.

To qualify for the Camembert label, the milk used must come from Normandy. In addition, there are other mandatory criteria and regulations. For example, Camembert de Normandie is shaped like a cylinder, 10.5 to 11 cm in diameter, and weighs a minimum of 250 g, net weight when packed. Or that it must be sold in a wooden box. It takes 2.2 l of milk to make one Camembert de Normandie.

Camembert is the living symbol of Normandy Know-how and probably its best ambassador. We can say that cheese is big In France.















WHAT IS CAMPUS FRANCE?

Campus France is a government agency that operates under the French Ministry of External Affairs and the Ministry of higher Education and Research. In India the Campus France network is a part of the cooperation service of the French Embassy in India. Campus France provide personalised counselling sessions and organize various workshops throughout the year for students looking to pursue education in France. AFTER MOVING TO FRANCE, SHE FURTHER DEVELOPED HER LANGUAGE SKILLS

DID YOU STUDY AT THE ALLIANCE FRANÇAISE CHANDIGARH BEOFRE MOVING TO FRANCE?

WHAT DO YOU TAKE AWAY FROM YOUR FRENCH EXPERIENCE? WHERE ARE YOU IN LIFE NOW?




Why did you picked-up that program?





FAREWELL INTERVIEW OF OUR DIRECTOR

Ophélie has been the director of Alliance Française Chandigarh for the last 5 years. She started traveling at an early age, spending the first year of her life in Morocco. From mainland France, she moved with her parents to the French oversea territory of la Reunion at a very young age. La Reunion is a tropical, nature-oriented island located of the eastern coast of Africa, located 10,000 km away from the mainland. She began her higher education on the Island and then moved to mainland France to specialize, where she studied culture and communication and then French as a foreign language. She often lived abroad, such as in countries like Madagascar, Nepal, Mauritius and now India.

What's your role as director of the Alliance?

As director, my role is to have an overview of all the departments and to understand both what works well and what can cause problems. It's essential to master the inner workings of the structure, to identify the strengths and weaknesses of each member of staff, so as to be able to make the necessary adjustments. In the Alliances Françaises network, it is often said that a director is like a Swiss Army knife: he or she must possess a wide range of skills and be able to get involved in all areas. Each Alliance Française operates in a unique context, which makes the job both demanding and exciting. As a language and cultural center, our mission goes far beyond administration: the director, often a French citizen, embodies the living link with France. My day-to-day tasks are varied, but mainly administrative, involving the management of our various projects, as well as the human and financial follow-up of the structure.



How did the Alliance Française Chandigarh changed during your time in office?

I arrived in September 2020, right in the middle of the covid crisis, so my 2 first years at the Alliance was under lockdown. This wasn't the ideal conditions to start in a new country as it was very difficult to meet anyone for a long time. But I got through it. When you move abroad regularly, you need to develop a certain sense of adaptation.

Among our most notable achievements, several are linked to the modernization of our services and the improvement of our facilities. We have, for example, installed a professional Wi-Fi solution, set up course management software, equipped all our classrooms with interactive digital screens, and opened a genuine French-style cafeteria. We've also redesigned the reception and social areas to make them more pleasant. On the cultural front, I've had the opportunity to coordinate festivals and artist tours on a national scale, for the benefit of the entire network of Alliances Françaises in India. Of course, these advances are not the fruit of individual efforts: they are the result of a concerted effort.



What do you like the most about this Alliance?

is that it owns its buildings! So it's possible to really improve the space and make it a great place to socialize. What's more, its location is ideal, next to the Hibiscus Garden, ensuring peace and quiet.

There have been a number of cultural events in recent years, but I think the most significant was that we were the first to resume a cultural program after the covid. I remember the first concert during the "Bonjour India" festival in 2022: young people were dancing like crazy in front of the stage, something that rarely happened afterwards. I think there was a real need to let loose after 2 years of being cooped up at home.

What will you keep with you of your stay in India?

I was already familiar with Indian culture before moving to India, as coming from the Indian Ocean islands brings you into close contact with Tamil culture. So in the end, I was mostly familiar with the culture of southern India, which of course has nothing in common with that of northern India. It was a real eye-opener for me, discovering the fascinating history of Punjab, Sikhism and Partition. What I'll take back in my luggage from India and Chandigarh: lots of friendships, Kerala cuisine (sorry Punjab, too much ghee gravy for me), block print and patience. I've obviously traveled a lot, but I still have a lot to discover. Here are my top 3 destinations to return to for a relaxing vacation: Ladakh, Goa and Pondicherry, the most memorable destination being Ladakh and its unique Himalayan landscapes.

What is your favorite place in Chandigarh?

My favorite places in Chandigarh are Sukhna Lake, outside peak weekend hours, and the forest behind the lake. I also like Sector 10, with its museums and restaurants. I think it's a very pleasant area with a lot of interesting activities.

What are you planning to do next?

After that, I'll be heading to Reunion Island, where I've got my ties, to take some time for myself. After that, it's the unknown! We'll see what comes up, both professionally and personally.

I wish the entire team, as well as the teachers, continued success in their work, innovation and the development of this fine institution. They can be proud of what they accomplish every day: their commitment is the strength of this Alliance.


